#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

• The Business of U.K. Football is an experiential three credit special topics Business course. Students will spend classroom time reading, discussing, learning

- about, and experiencing through various mediums the business aspects of football in the U.K.
- Students will travel to the England during Spring Break 2015 for an intensive look at business aspects of football. The students prepare for their trip to England with readings, videos, and guest speakers. While in England during Spring Break, students will visit football clubs they have studied through readings and classroom discussions, meet with various club officials to learn about the business aspects of football in the U.K. and have the opportunity to attend several football matches.

#### **LEARNING OBJECTIVES:**

This course will expose UMW students to global business perspectives by offering them an opportunity to study abroad. The purposes of the course are:

- To understand of how functional areas of business (e.g., marketing, accounting, finance, and management) operate in the U.K. football environment.
- o To understand the impact of football in the U.K. on the economic, historical, and cultural aspects of the U.K.
- o To improve students' oral presentation skills.
- o To appreciate the importance of global business.
- o To develop students' ability to be more flexible and open to change.

#### INSTRUCTION METHODOLOGY:

Instruction methodology may include lectures, participative class discussions, guest lectures, presentations, and cases. Note however, that this course is structured primarily with a discussion format in mind; that is, students will be expected to prepare readings and assignments *BEFORE* attending class so that such assignments may be used as a basis for interactive discussion.

#### **GROUP PRESENTATIONS:**

Each group will be required to give a presentation on one HBR soccer related case. Although each group will present once, each group must also complete and submit a group paper addressing the case questions in another case assigned to different group.

#### **CURRENT EVENT MINI PRESENTATIONS:**

Each week, every student (this is an individual assignment) will be required to give a short (3-4 minute) mini presentation on a current event related to soccer. In your mini

presentation, you will need to summarize the current event and provide your own discussion and analysis as to why the event is important to the club and to football in general. The following websites may be useful for finding current events related to football:

#### **BALANCED SCORECARD PROJECT:**

Each student is required to complete a project related to the balanced scorecard and football. In this project, each student is required to choose a football team and develop a balanced scorecard for this team. The details of this project are listed in a separate document. Note that this is an individual project.

#### MINICASE/RESEARCH ASSIGNMENTS (MCRS):

Over the course of the semester there will be **several minicase/research assignments.** The MCR assignments are designed to provide practical experience and/or to promote study of selected topics. The MCR assignments for this course will require you to either perform practical exercises applying course concepts or exploratory research for course topics. Such assignments will be used as a basis for class discussion and to promote interaction between you and other students. A separate set of documents will be posted detailing the requirements for these assignments. These cases are to be completed in groups.

MCR assignments will be evaluated based on the valiant effort criteria; that is, they will be graded for a reasonable attempt to complete the assignment (not for "correctness", correctness, so to speak, will be checked on exam day). I grade for presentation (writing style), and completeness/apparent effort. For assignments that require outside research, references for your sources should be provided.

#### **JOURNAL:**

Students will be required to keep a journal during the study abroad portion of the course. A template for the journal is provided in a separate document.
